


DID YOU KNOW?

In November each year, Swiss children in various cantons keep up an old tradition and produce traditional "Räbenliechtli" lanterns from turnips. They take the top of, remove the insides, and carve their names, sun, moon or stars etc into the walls, insert little candles and meet in the evening for a procession through the streets.

In the Middle Ages, beets/turnips were an important staple food. In November, to celebrate the last harvest of the year, lanterns were carved out of the turnips, and the children carried them through the village in the evening.





Christmas Market at the **Einsiedeln Abbev**

Einsiedeln Abbey (German: Kloster Einsiedeln) is a Benedictine monastery in the village of Einsiedeln in the canton of Schwyz, Switzerland. The abbey is dedicated to Our Lady of the Hermits, the title being derived from the circumstances of its foundation, for the first inhabitant of the region was Saint Meinrad, a hermit.

More than 130 Christmas stalls along the main street and on the abbey square make Einsiedeln's traditional Christmas Market one of the largest in Switzerland Besides Christmas handicrafts, Glühwein (mulled wine) and gingerbread a broad variety of all sorts of goods is offered for sale.

There is also the world's largest Christmas crib in the Diorama Bethlehem and the gingerbread bakery museum at the "Goldpafel"bakery.

Parliamo due o piú lingue, siamo poliglotti?

Mercoledí scorso, trá una partita e l'altra di yass, il nostro presidente José Jungo mi ha chiesto "Sai ancora parlare l'italiano? Potresti scrivere un articolo in italiano per la nostra rivista?" "Certo che parlo ancora l'italiano, é la mia lingua materna!!" ho pensato io un po' indignato. Ma veramente? lo sono stato abbastanza fortunato di essere cresciuto in Ticino con un padre ticinese e una madre svizzera tedesca. A casa la nostra lingua era un misto di dialetto e schwitzerdüch, mischiato con parole inesistenti fatte sú a metá di una lingua e l'altra. Ogni anno, cosí che i miei genitori potessero andare a far vacanze per conto loro, il mio fratello maggiore ed io andavamo in vacanza a Flawil dai nostri nonni materni e per un paio di mesi parlavamo esclusivamente lo schwitzerdüch. Da ragazzi eravamo avidi lettori, non solo fumetti ma anche i classici per giovani: l'isola del tesoro, i tré moschietteri, il principe e il povero, I libri della giungla e molti altri dei guali non ricordo piú I titoli. Quando la mia mamma andava a Lugano a fare la spesa alla Migros ci portava sempre a casa un paio di libri dei Mondadori (uno ciascuno) e in pochi giorni li avevamo letti. Per mé la passione per la lettura continuó anche a scuola e posso dire che il mio vocabulario era abbastanza esteso. Piú tardi I miei studi mi portarono a Losanna e durante quei tré anni ho migliorato il mio francese scolastico. Piú tardi sono venuto in Australia e per piú di trent'anni ho parlato quasi solo l'inglese. Sono dunque un poliglotta? Dal mio punto di vista, no. Adesso il mio inglese é buono ma quando faccio le parole crociate richiedo spesso l'aiuto di un dizionario e sono grato di avere "spellcheck" sul computer per la corrispondenza ufficiale. Il mio francese non é mai stato eccellente, leggere quello che avevo scritto era sovente un passatempo divertente per i compagni di studio e adesso faccio fatica a parlarlo. Il schwitzerdüch é ancora peggio perché guando devo parlare con i miei parenti che parlano solo quello, lo

mischio con l'inglese e non mi accorgo neanche di farlo. Sono contento di aver incominciato di andare alle serate di vass perché mi danno l'occasione di ri-imparare un po' di schwitzerdüch. L'italiano lo parlo ancora certamente. Ma il mio vocabulario, con anni di mancanza di uso. é diventato cosí ristretto che io lo definirei quasi come "basilare". Le poche volte che devo leggere qualche cosa di ufficiale ho delle difficoltá e adesso, con il mio fratello minore, quando ci sendiamo messaggi email scriviamo in dialetto fonetico perché lui dice che "altrimenti sa capisum mia". E per questo, caro il mio Jose', quando mi hai chiesto di scriverti qualche cosa in italiano dapprima ho pensato di scriverti un pezzo letterario in un soggetto interessante e impegnativo ma in realtá questo mio mischiuccio sulle mie capacitá linguali é tutto quello che sono riuscito a pensare di fare.

If we speak two languages or more, are we polyglots?

Last Wednesday, in between games of yass, our president José Jungo asked me "Do you still speak Italian? Would you be able to write an article in Italian for our Swiss News?" "Certainly I can still speak Italian, it's my mother tongue!!" I thought a little bit miffed. But really? I was reasonably lucky to have grown up in Ticino with a swiss italian father and a swiss german mother. At home our language was a mixture of italian and schwitzerdüetsch, mixed with non-existent words made up with half of each two languages. Every year, so that my parents could go on holidays on their own, my older brother and I went on holiday to Flawil at my maternal grandparents and for a couple of months we spoke exclusively schwitzerdüetsch. As kids we were avid readers, not just comics but also children



classics like Treasure Island. The Three Musketeers, The Prince and the Pauper, the Jungle Book and many others of which I don't remember the titles. When my mother used to go into Lugano shopping at Migros she would always bring us home a couple of books from Mondadori (one each) and we would have them read in a couple of days. For me the passion for reading continued throughout the school years and I can honestly say that I had a fairly extended vocabulary. Later in life my studies took me to Lausanne where for three years I improved on my school level french. Later on I came to Australia and for more than thirty years I have spoken practically only english. Am I therefore a polyglot? In my opinion, no. Now my English is good but when I do crosswords I am constantly consulting the dictionary and I am grateful to have "spellcheck" on my computer for my official correspondence. My french was never excellent, to read what I had written was often an amusing pastime for my fellow students and now I struggle to speak it. My schwitzerdüetch is even worse because

when I have to speak to my relatives who only speak that I mix it with english words without realising I am doing it. I am glad I joined the yass group as it's an occasion to re-learn the schwitzerdüetsch. I still speak italian.

The few times that I have to read official correspondence I have difficulties and now when my younger brother and I send each other emails we write in phonetic dialect because he says "otherwise we don't understand each other". It is for this reason, my dear Jose, that when you asked me to write something in italian at first I thought to write a literary masterpiece in an interesting and riveting subject but in reality this "miss-match"




