Mobile Passport Station coming to Brisbane, Mackay, Cairns and Darwin

Dear Fellow Citizens.

Do you need or wish to renew your Swiss passport and/or ID card? The mobile passport station is travelling to Queensland and the Northern Territory in 2018.

The Consulate General of Switzerland in Sydney is happy to announce that it will operate a mobile passport station at the following locations and dates:

Brisbane and Mackay:

from 14.5.18 to 18.5.2018 (venues to be advised at a later stage)

Darwin and Cairns: from 21.5.18 to 25.5.2018 (venues to be advised at a later stage)

PLEASE NOTE:

Location Mackay only if enough applicants. Should the number be too low, the applicants will have to switch to location Brisbane or Cairns.

During this visit we will collect your photo, fingerprints and signature. The data is required to issue your new Swiss travel document that complies with today's requirements to authenticate the identity of travelers. Please note that biometric data cannot be stored for future reference and a new travel document will be issued right after collection of your biometric data

Should you wish to apply for a Swiss travel document and have your biometric data registered at one of the above locations, please sign up online on the following website by Sunday 25.3.2018 at the latest!

Important: In the last field of the application, under remark, please write where you wish to have your biometric data taken, either in Brisbane, Mackay, Cairns or Darwin.

For applicants to Mackay: Please indicate a second location to have your biometric data taken in case there are not enough applicants for Mackay, i.e. Mackay or Brisbane OR Mackay or Cairns.

Detailed information about the costs involved, which documents we require from you and how to make an appointment will be sent out upon receipt of your online application. If you haven't received such information by 15.04.2018, please contact the Consulate.

The deadline to apply online is Sunday, 25.03.2018

Useful information:

Two staff members of the Consulate General of Switzerland in Sydney will be welcoming those who have a confirmed appointment in the chosen location from 14.05.2018 to 25.05.2018. Due to a very tight schedule we can only accommodate customers with an appointment.

As a Swiss citizen you do not lose your nationality when your Swiss passport expires. Your nationality is granted to you by being registered at your place of origin in Switzerland. This registration entitles you to a Swiss passport whenever you require one. However, since 2010 biometric data has to be registered (photo, fingerprints and signature) in order to obtain a new Swiss travel document. The data can only be collected at a Cantonal passport office in Switzerland or at a Swiss representation abroad. The competent Swiss passport office for your place of residence is located in Svdney.

It is also an option to have your biometric data registered during your next visit to Switzerland. This however involves an online passport application that needs to be checked by the Consulate General in Sydney. We will arrange an appointment at your preferred passport office in Switzerland for you. When completing the online application it is therefore important that you let us know under the section "remarks" in which canton and on which date you would like to have your biometric data registered.

These visits are part of the Consulates effort to bring its services closer to the Swiss community. However, for financial reasons, there is no guarantee that it will be possible in the future to offer such services on a recurring basis.

We look forward to seeing you either in Brisbane, Mackay, Darwin or Cairns.

Dear friends of the choir,

The choir is already almost fully booked for this year. Now we are entering into exciting but time consuming preparations. We are planning our program and we have selected a theme. Ideas for the songs and music pieces are being brainstormed during rehearsals and we even do some jamming.

In the last few years it worked to have a master program for the whole year and then adapt to the different audiences, events and venues. Each performance will always be quite unique.

A lot of thought goes into the flow of the performance. Visually we try to arrange ourselves in a interesting way and that the audience members don't have a blocked view. Since we often move between songs and music we optimise our walking around and try do move as efficiently as possible. Acoustics are most important. We have to pay attention if we are outdoors and can hardly hear each other or how the room is shaped and where we can perform the best.

When you see us warming up you observe that we move around and find the best location and arrangement for us and for the best enjoyment of our audience.

It also makes a huge difference who is standing where. We have sound checks where we test different configurations. Traditionally the yodelers are in the middle but we get a much better sound quality at the moment when we have the tenors and bases in the middle.

While we brainstorm for a theme we are looking for the yodels to match. Is there one in our repertoire we have not sung for a while? Does it suit our current configuration of our members and voices? Are there new songs out in Switzerland? Can we find the music or do we have to adapt the score?

This idea to talk more about what goes on behind the scenes comes from watching the athlete Cedric Dubler's you tube channel. I didn't know anything about decathlon but now that I see how much thought, planning and effort goes into the training I have a lot of respect for him.

We wish Cedric, a member of the Swiss Society of Queensland and son of one of our members great success at the coming Commonwealth Games at the Gold Cost.

Turtle Rock


moderate walk Sunday, 6 May 2018

The once-a-year event not to be missed at the Swiss Club!

Fondue originated in Switzerland

as a way of using up hardened cheese. Deriving from the French verb fondre, meaning "to melt," fondue was a classic peasant dish. Accounts vary on how fondue was originally created. Traditional fondue is made with a mixture of Emmenthaler and/or Gruyere cheese and wine, melted in a communal pot. Cherry brandy is added to the melted mixture, which becomes

a dip for pieces of stale bread and crusts.

French gastronome Brillat-Savarin mentioned fondue in his 19th century writings, but fondue really hit its heyday in 1956, when chef Konrad Egli of New York's Chalet Swiss Restaurant introduced a fondue method of cooking meat cubes in hot oil.The chocolate fondue followed in 1964 as another way of indulging in something delicious.

The Consular Corps could organise a Friendly 2018 Soccer Fundraiser Tournament amongst our countries before the 2018 World Cup.

The World Cup commences on 14 June and finishes on 15 July 2018.

The weekend of 9/10 June is proposed for the Festival, however, we are open for suggestions.

Our members could engage in inviting the citizens of their own to form teams to compete. We could possibly organise a soccer field and a place where we can hold a BBQ. Players and non-players are invited to attend. The more the better.

We also suggest we use this Tournament to raise donations and put them towards Domestic Violence initiatives with respected Australian institutions.

There is a concern about the high number of migrant women who are a victim of Domestic Violence.

1 On average, one woman a week is murdered by her current or former partner, according to the most recent analysis of homicide statistics in Australia.1

- 2 The 2016 Victorian Royal Commission into Family Violence found that people from culturally and linguistically diverse communities are more likely to face barriers to obtaining help for family violence.
- 3 Women from diverse backgrounds are amongst those at the greatest risk of family violence.
- 4 Some women on visas are afraid to report domestic abuse for fear of deportation.
- 5 One in three Australian women has experienced physical violence, since the age of 15.
- 6 One in five Australian women has experienced sexual violence.
- 7 One in four Australian women has experienced physical or sexual violence by an intimate partner.

Possible donations might go to White Ribbon's "Breaking the Silence" program or helping existing social-change school programs.

HELLO, GRUEZI, BONJOUR, BUONGIORNO!

Switzerland, known for its watches, chocolates, cheese and the beautiful scenery, is also very proud of its traditions, some better known like fondues, yodelling and banking and our national game of "Jass".

The Game of Jass is played everywhere, in pubs, clubs, around the family table, on holidays, in the army, etc. Many tournaments and championships are held throughout the year.

And so it is the same here in Australia, where Swiss Communities uphold this tradition. There are Club- and Regional Championships as well as the Annual Australian Tournament. The latter is held in most Australian Capital Cities and now in 2018 it will be Brisbane's turn.





DID YOU KNOW?

The steepest funicular railway in the world is in Switzerland and operates from Schwyz to Stoos. It has a 110 per cent maximum incline which is a world record. It took 14 years to plan and implement (talk about patience!). 110 per cent incline means 100m horizontal for 110m up which is therefore steeper than 45 degrees. The Gotthard Railway has a maximum incline of 2.7 per cent.

With a 128 per cent incline the Scenic Railway in Katoomba (Australia) is even steeper than the new railway on Stoos. However, due to the technology the Scenic Railway is considered an inclined lift and not a funicular railway. Thus the steepest funicular railway in the world is the one leading to Stoos.

A funicular is one of the modes of transport, along with a cable railway and an inclined

elevator, which uses a cable traction for movement on a steep slope.

A pair of vehicles are pulled on a slope by a cable which loops over a pulley wheel at the upper end of a track. While one vehicle is ascending the other one is descending the track and thus they are counterbalancing each other. Both vehicles are permanently attached to a cable which distinguishes them from a cable railway.

Funiculars of one type or another have existed for hundreds of years, and they continue to be used for moving both passengers and goods. The name "funicular" itself is derived from the Latin word funiculus, the diminutive of funis, which translates as "rope".

And it was cold in Switzerland!

A freak warming around the North Pole has sent a blast of Arctic cold over Europe in February. The World Meteorological Organisation says the chill in Europe was caused by a "sudden stratospheric warming" above the North Pole that led to a split in the polar vortex, a cold area of air above the Arctic that spilled cold south.
