# **Camping Weekend**

Murphy's Creek Escape is a picturesque campground, offering powered, non-powered and remote camping in a natural bushland setting. The sites are quite large and shady. It takes 1½ hours to drive from Brisbane and 25 minutes to Toowoomba. The campground is well equipped, with a large camp kitchen and communal fire pit; there is also a small shop. All sorts of activities are on offer on site, some of them for a fee. There is a sandy beach along Murphy's creek within the campground, water cannot be guaranteed though.

A 25 minutes drive will take you to Toowoomba, where the famous Carnival of Flowers is on that week, a must see if you have never been. The monthly markets at Cabarlah are on that Sunday. Crows Nest National Park and a few lakes are within about a 45 minutes drive as is Darling Downs Zoo in Pilton.

We have tentatively booked a few powered sites and an unpowered group site, individual unpowered sites are also available. As always we would plan for a communal dinner on Saturday night. Prices range from \$26 unpowered to \$41 powered sites including two adults.

With holidays and also the last weekend of the Toowoomba Carnival of Flowers bookings would have to be confirmed soon.

### My Story... or "get to know your SSQ members"

My name is Florido Oskar Bizzozero and I was born in Ticino seventy years ago. My father was from Ticino but my mother was from Flawil (SG), hence my middle name Oskar. I migrated to Australia in August 1971 and now live in Brisbane with my wife Jan. During my whole life, when I came to a cross road, there was always someone who would influence the decision I made and shape the rest of my life. The first time, a friend who did an apprenticeship as Radio Technician with me in Lugano convinced me to go to a Technical College for Engineers. I applied and gained a scholarship, enrolled with the Technicum of Lausanne (VD) and passed the admission exams. At the last minute my friend pulled out but for me it was far too late, my parents would never forgive me. The second time, towards the end of my studies, discussing what we were going to do with our lives after we had finished technical college one of my class mates said he was going to migrate to Australia to improve his English. He said the Australian Government would pay the fares to get you there, feed you until you found a job and if you stayed more than two years you didn't have to pay back a single penny, so what choice did I have but to join him? The original plan was to spend twelve months in Sydney, learn the language by going to classes and then tour Australia on a working holiday for the remaining twelve months. We stuck to the plan for the first twelve months and left Sydney to depart on our working holiday. First stop: Mount Isa. We both got a well-paid job at the mines, which I liked, so we decided to stay six months and then move on. But I also met a primary school teacher who I liked even more. After six months I told my friend that if he wanted to continue on the working holiday he would be on his own. He moved on but he only got as far as Darwin where he aborted the trip for the same reasons as I did and still lives there to this day. Jan, the teacher I had met, went to visit her family and I must have missed her so much that I asked her to marry me. We married in December 74. packed up our goods and chattels, travelled

through the USA, Mexico and Canada, called it our honeymoon, and settled back in Switzerland. After nearly three years in Ticino we met a couple of Australians who were looking for someone to travel overland with to return to Australia. True to the established pattern in my life I decided we should go with them. We resigned from our jobs and gave up our apartment in Ticino but at the last moment they pulled out from doing the overland trip. Jan and I came back to Australia, but by plane with stopovers in Egypt, India, Hong Kong and Philippines. The job market in Australia was pretty tight so we went back to Mount Isa because we knew we could both get a job there. After a year or so of living there we applied for adoption and in 1983 we became parents of two little brothers, Gary who was nearly five and Damian, who was three and a half. We raised our family in Mount Isa and stayed there for over thirty years. In all that time I haven't met anyone that would again change my course. Mount Isa has been good to us - both professionally and friends-wise and once one gets over the mindset that it's isolated, it's not such a bad place. It has the beauty and ruggedness of the Outback and one gets used to the long drives. The financial benefits associated with working in isolated

mining towns afforded us a reasonably good life, lots of travelling and a comfortable retirement. Although we enjoyed our time there, we never intended to retire in Mount Isa so we moved to where we are now, which is delightfully rural but only an hour from Brisbane CBD. It really suits us.

P.S. In 1973 when I lived in Mount Isa, at the request of my grandmother a television crew came to film me to appear on a program called "Together for Christmas", a documentary on Ticinese migrants, which was shown on the Swiss Italian Television. Recently a journalist from Lugano and a Ticinese cameraman did a follow-up on that program and came to interview me in Brisbane. This second appearance will be shown at Christmas time on a show called "Quotidiano" and will also feature some of our Swiss Club regular jass players. Jan and I were filmed walking down the main street in Dayboro, at the bakery and in a café. You can imagine the puzzled and enquiring looks from the locals!!!

### For sale: Qld sapphires



### Once upon a time...

It sounds a bit like a fairy tale how the Swiss Community Care Society came into the possession of a box full of Sapphires.

There was this Swiss man working the gem fields of Queensland quite some time ago. The story goes that he had mental problems and was convinced somebody was trying to rob him. So he asked Walter Billeter, the former president of the SCCS, to look after a box of sapphires for him when he went out bush again where he sadly died. Walter Billeter was able to locate his sister in Switzerland who decided to donate the stones to the Swiss Community Care Society.

The box was guarded by subsequent presidents of the Society, every now and then the topic came up in committee meetings but we somehow never took it further.

We were finally put in contact with Sue, a certified valuer and her husband Robert, a mastercutter. Sue checked the stones and put a value on all of them. There are uncut stones and a large number of cut stones of different colours and cuts.

But as wonderful as the donation is we can only put them to good use for the SCCS if we sell them. According to Sue the market is very unpredictable. We could put them up for auction but we may not get near the real value.

So, here is where you all come in – in a first round we give you the opportunity to buy a sapphire and at the same time support the Swiss Community Care Society, they start at \$105 and go up to \$1,975. Some of them look quite stunning, what a wonderful gift they could be.

For the genuinely interested we can send photos of the gems with costs and arrange a viewing.





#### **Emmental Switzerland**

The Emmental is a valley in west central Switzerland, forming part of the canton of Bern. It is a hilly landscape comprising the basins of the Emme and Ilfis rivers. The region is mostly devoted to farming, particularly dairy farming. The principal settlements are the city of Burgdorf and the town of Langnau. The region comprises relatively low mountains on the right bank of the Aare. Its principal elevation is the Napf, a mountain dominating the northern part of the Emmental Alps. The original Emmental cheese is produced there, and the dairy industry still dominates the local economy. Pottery from the region is also prized, and the ceramics of the region have endured practically unchanged since the 17th century. The novelist Jeremias Gotthelf (1797-1854) was a pastor in the Emmental and wrote about the region.
