


### **DID YOU KNOW?**

The World Solar Challenge (WSC), or the Bridgestone World Solar Challenge since 2013, tied to the sponsorship of Bridgestone Corporation is the world's most well-known solar-powered car race event. A biennial road race covering 3,022 km (1,878 mi) through the Australian Outback, from Darwin, Northern Territory, to Adelaide, South Australia, created to foster the development of experimental, solar-powered vehicles.

The race attracts teams from around the world. Since 2001 the World Solar Challenge was won seven times out of nine efforts by the Nuna team and cars of the Delft University of Technology from the Netherlands, with only the Tokai Challenger, built by the Tokai University of Japan able to take the crown in 2009 and 2011.

## Kokoda Challenge – thank you to all the SSQ donors

My name is Jessica Nick. I was born in Australia to Swiss parents. My school participates every year in the Kokoda Challenge. This consists of walking 48km to commemorate the troops that walked the actual 96km Kokoda Track in Papua New Guinea. As part of the challenge, each team (consisting of 5 people) must raise at least \$350 to go towards the Kokoda Youth Foundation. The money raised goes towards enabling local teenagers from all social backgrounds and circumstance to undergo a life changing 14 month program.

When I attended the Jass Championship in Brisbane this April, I told everyone that I would complete the challenge and they very kindly put in donations. I was amazed at how

generous everyone was and I just want to express my gratitude again.

On the morning of the challenge, the starting line was flooded with participants and the teenagers in the Kokoda Youth Program were helping out and cheering everyone on. The morning started at 4am and it was freezing cold (for Australia). It was exhausting as the terrain was rough and very steep

but at the same time it was "kinda" fun. My team finished just over 10 hours and I was ecstatic with the experience.

It was so challenging and fun that I hope to be able to participate again next year.

### **DID YOU KNOW?**

There is no doubt the Kokoda Trail is a challenging trek, however if you are well prepared and have done the required amount of training you will be ready to take on this challenge. Kokoda is not the demon it is portrayed and everyday people complete Kokoda – young and old. With Mt

Everest Base Camp being a 10/10 difficulty level and walking around the block a 1/10, Kokoda rates as a 7/10, with moderate cardio fitness required.

# Das Wasserschloss der Schweiz (The "water castle" of Switzerland)

The area in the triangle of Brugg, Windisch, Gebenstorf, Turgi, Stilli and Untersiggenthal is known as the "water castle" of Switzerland. It is where the three rivers Aare, Reuss and Limmat unite at the Gebenstorf district Vogelsang, in the middle of Aargau. The Aare flows from there to the north through a wide transverse valley of the Jura and reaches the Rhine near Koblenz.

From this river system of the Aare, Reuss and Limmat, together with the important tributaries Zihl, Saane, Emme, Sarner Aa and Linth, flows the water from 40% of the total area of Switzerland together, in the canton of Aargau. The catchment area encompasses Central Switzerland, the Bernese Oberland, the Fribourg alps, large parts of the midland cantons of Aargau, Neuchâtel, Vaud, Solothurn and Zurich, the canton of Glarus and the western regions of the Canton of St Gallen.

In 1989, the Council of the Canton of Aargau protected this unique floodplain landscape. The area is considered an area of national importance and is classified in the category of important Swiss landscapes.

# Blonay-Chamby Railway Museum since 1978

In 1968, six adults, including Gabriel's dad, formed the Blonay-Chamby Museum Railway Association and started a railway which connects the 3km between CEV Chemins de Fer Veveysans and MOB Montreux Oberland Bernois, after the line was abandoned by CEV for a few years. The tunnel and the bridge added to the very attractive scenery down to Lake Geneva and France's Alps with Mont Blanc.

51 years ago, the Association acquired two locomotives from the German railway Zell-Todtnau. Then came an engine from France, etc. As a teenager I went to Rimini to collect an old steam tramway which looks absolutely schmick. The 104 has been my favourite engine with 550HP.

An incredible core of mechanics, retired and young, volunteer their time for the passion of steam and electric locomotives. I appreciate particularly seeing young people joining.

Over the years, I was a heater in the steam engine, became a tram driver and responsible for the whole train (Zugführer), while shunting the carriages at either end of the line (see Gabriel in action in the top photo, left).

The Museum grew over the years from a rudimentary place for storage to what is now a proud place to repair and display. At

special occasions we undertake excursions to neighbouring railways MOB and GFM in Gruyère.

If you are in Switzerland between May and October, have a trip to the past and observe the eyes of the young children in admiration.
