

Queenslanders go through 2.7 billion drink containers each year? *Containers for Change* has created

a way to recycle those containers and positively impact the environment and the communities. By encouraging individuals and groups to take part, you can help create jobs in metropolitan and regional areas, and support local economies. Container refund point operators sort them into material types before a logistics provider transports them to be processed. The containers are then prepared for recycling at the processing facility before accredited recyclers purchase the processed materials which they transform into new containers and other products.

Information from the Swiss Consulate Sydney regarding COVID-19 certificates and travel to Switzerland

You will be able to travel to Switzerland with your Australian COVID-19 certificate, **but** you will need a Swiss covid-19 certificate for access to events or facilities in Switzerland.

Having said that, all persons who have been vaccinated abroad with a vaccine approved by the European Medicines Agency (EMA List, see https://www.ema.europa.eu/en) and who are resident in Switzerland, staying in Switzerland, or intend to enter Switzerland, are now able to obtain a Swiss COVID-19 certificate on presentation of their foreign vaccination certificate. You can apply for the Swiss COVID-19 certificate using the following online form (https://covidcertificateform.admin.ch/foreign). The canton where you are resident or staying will issue the certificate.

Health restrictions currently in place in Switzerland:

Covid-19-related entry restrictions are the responsibility of the Federal Office of Public Health (FOPH) and you will find all the necessary information here (https://www. bag.admin.ch/bag/en/home/krankheiten/ ausbrueche-epidemien-pandemien/ aktuelle-ausbrueche-epidemien/novel-cov/ empfehlungen-fuer-reisende/quarantaeneeinreisende.html#1918240392).

The interactive travel check tool (https:// travelcheck.admin.ch) shows what measures currently apply if you travel to Switzerland from Australia. However, depending on the airline, different rules may apply and therefore we strongly advise to check with the airline to find out which requirements have to be fulfilled at check-in at the airport, which documents need to be presented, in which form the covid-19 certificate or the PCR Test has to be shown, etc. If you are unable to present all documents required by the airline you may not be allowed to board the plane.

Furthermore, all incoming travellers must complete an entry form when travelling to Switzerland, which can be found at https://swissplf.admin.ch/formular. Fill out the electronic entry form on a computer or smartphone before you enter Switzerland or during travel. Once you've filled out the form you'll be emailed a QR code as confirmation. Have this code ready for inspection when you enter Switzerland. If you are controlled you can show the QR code

Application for a Swiss COVID certificate

From 25 October 2021, only EU-compatible COVID-19 certificates are permitted in Switzerland. Alternatives such as a vaccination booklet in paper form may not be accepted when entering Switzerland. In Switzerland, you need a COVID-19 certificate to access most public facilities. Do you have a valid EU COVID-19 certificate (EU-DCC)? This is valid in Switzerland. Have you been vaccinated or recovered abroad and do not have an EU-DCC? Apply for a Swiss COVID certificate. You can find all information here:

https://www.covidcertificate-form.admin. ch/foreign

The processing of an application can take up to 5 working days. If you are a Swiss citizen or have another official residence permit or permanent domicile in Switzerland, the procedure is free of charge. If you do not meet any of these on your smartphone or produce a printed confirmation.

All these rules are subject to change at any time and therefore we advise you to consult the relevant websites regularly in order to get the latest news. You will need to use a transfer code. Download via the **Covid Cert** App. I recommend to download the App to your mobile phone **before you start** with the application. They will also send you a security code via your email before you can continue using the application form.

I had to upload a copy of my (Swiss) passport (I've only uploaded the first page without the signature part) plus a copy of my International Australian COVID-certificate (pdf format worked well). The certificate was then transfered/downloaded to the App on my mobile phone (hubby's worked on the first attempt, mine took three attempts for some reason – glitch?).





WELCOME HOME Our Olympic and Paralympic athletes were celebrated at City Hall

Queensland-based Olympic and Paralympic athletes were celebrated at the Brisbane City Hall on 8 October. Queensland Premier Ms Palaszczuk joined Brisbane Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner to welcome home and congratulate our athletes and to present the athletes with the Keys to the City.

The event has marked one of Australia's most successful Olympic campaigns, with athletes bringing home 17 gold, seven silver and 22 bronze medals.

Keys to the City of Brisbane

The granting of the Keys to the City is a symbolic presentation that represents the highest honour that a city can confer on an individual or an organisation. The Keys to the City of Brisbane is traditionally presented by the Lord Mayor at a Civic Reception to acknowledge the achievement/contribution of an individual or organisation in furthering the ideals of the city.

It may also be awarded to recognise outstanding achievement in sport, community or humanitarian work by a Brisbane resident at an International or National level.

The tradition of using a key dates back to medieval times, when many cities were enclosed within walled fortifications. The key symbolised the relationship between a city and the king or ruler of the land on which the city was located.

When that ruler visited the city for the first time after assuming power, the authorities would formally greet them at the gates to the city and hand over the key to signify that the city was now under his control. The ruler would then return the key to the city authorities to acknowledge that they intended to respect the political authority of those who administered the city.

Morcote Ticino Switzerland

Morcote is first mentioned historically in 926 as Murcau, which comes from the Latin *Morae caput*, meaning head of the hill.

Starting around 1100, Morcote was home to a castle that was built to quard and control commerce on the lake. Until the dam was built in Melide in 1847. Morcote was the largest port on Lake Lugano. Goods from northern Italy were shipped across the lake to the rest of Ticino. The Chapel of S. Antonio Abate with its monumental staircase, the Parish Church of S. Maria del Sasso with Oratory, the Cimitero monumentale (Cemetery) and Scherrer Park are listed as Swiss heritage site of national significance. The entire village of Morcote is part of the Inventory of Swiss Heritage Sites.
