Cornelia's family migrated from Zurich, Switzerland to Australia in 1953. Cornelia was 10 years and 7 months old.

Her first three years in Australia Cornelia spent in Victoria. In October 1956 her father bought 17 acres of virgin land in Kallangur, Queensland.

Cornelia was educated primarily in Australia: In Kedron State High School, she obtained her commercial Junior Certificate (year 10), at TAFE Queensland her Senior Certificate (year 12), at Kelvin Grove College of Advanced Education her diploma as a primary school teacher. Beginning 1959 Cornelia started work as a secretary with the Queensland Government.

By mid-1959 her mother went back to Switzerland, taking Cornelia, 17, with her. After her mother returned to Australia a year later. Cornelia moved to the Ticino to learn Italian. working as a waitress. She then went to Paris to study French. She concluded her 3 years in Europe in Marseille looking after children in an orphanage run by nuns.

At the age of 19. Cornelia returned to Australia. found a secretarial job in Petrie, where she worked for the following 5 years. Her teaching career began with country service in the outback, in Aramac in central Queensland.

In 1970, whilst still recuperating from a long and unhappy love affair, she met and reluctantly married the French immigrant, Phillipe Lecarre. After Marcel was born in 1972, the family bought the house in Bray Park in 1973, where their two daughters, Jeanne in 1974, and Dominique in 1976, were born.

The happy years unfortunately ended in divorce and Cornelia went to live in Atherton with her children in 1982, to be near her father. to whom she had always been very attached.

Cornelia was a woman of character.

courageous, strong-willed, and determined to keep her family together. Her positive thinking. infectious laugh and humorous attitude to life endeared her to her family and friends.

When her first grandchild was born in 1992 Cornelia was overjoyed. Her three children and eight grandchildren were Cornelia's pride and joy. She also loved dogs and cats, gardening, reading and, finally, playing cards with her friends and family.

Cornelia was always very proud of her Swiss heritage. She is sorely missed by her children, grandchildren, family, and her many friends.

#### Rest in Peace.

I met Cornelia as a patient in the Royal Brisbane Hospital around 1996/97. She was an amazing lady. She spoke Swiss as though she would have just moved from there!


We started a 'May I' game club in 2018 (this game is a version of Rummy). I said to her. we should do a competition, who can teach the most people the game. She loved it and taught it to all her friends, her children and grandchildren.

We played every 2 weeks, with lunch. The game takes 2-3 hours. It was a lot of fun.

She told me a funny story, she had a job in an orphanage in France, the Sister told her something, she said "oui, oui", but when the Sister fround, she said "no, no". She couldn't understand a word what they where saying.

I miss her a lot, she was a very good friend.

MBS Maryborough Building Supply owner Ernst 'Ernie' Hug and occasional visitor to our group has recently passed away. Ernie and his brother Werner were well known business owners in Maryborough. May Ernie Rest in Peace (see his Eulogy on the next page).

Ernst - Ernie Hug was born as the 3rd child to Hans and Luisa Hug on 17 April 1930 in Schwellbrun, Appenzell, Switzerland.

Erni's brother Werner immigrated to Australia in 1950. On his journey to Australia, he met another Swiss family, their daughter Hanna became his wife. Werner was an Architect and had started building houses in Hervey Bay with his future father-in-law Robert Ammann, but Robert wanted to return to farming and started a Pineapple Farm in Dundowran.

Ernie followed in the footsteps of his brother Werner and immigrated to Australia between 1951 and 1953. Ernie and his brother Werner then formed "Hua Brothers' construction company" in the early 50s, in the late 50s Hug's Hardware was opened, which later became MBS (Maryborough Building supplies).

Earnie married Mary McAulay on 23 June 1956. in Maryborough.

In 1959 Ernie Hug was nationalised and became a true-blue Aussie.

Werner had to complete more studies to get his Swiss Architect Diploma accepted here in Australia, during this time Erie was running the construction side of the company. Together they achieved great things, designing and building many commercial buildings and private homes in Maryborough and Hervey Bay.

One of their great legacies was the design and construction of the Rainbow Beach Hotel and a few years later some accommodation was added.

I recall Ernie saying "everybody thought we were crazy, because there was nothing in Rainbow Beach at the time".

They proved everybody wrong in having great foresight.

In the 80s the Hug brothers decided to go their separate ways. I believe Werner moved south with his family and Ernie staved in Maryborough with his wife Mary.

Ernie's niece Sue mentioned to me that he loved fishing and crabbing and used to take her and her siblings to Toogoom.

Ernie also had a passion for horseracing, having a punt gave him great satisfaction. One thing I remember him saying "never ever punt to make money, all these people saving I am winning. are not honest to themselves". He kept strict record of his wins and losses, he would only punt a certain amount every week over a 30year period, (he showed me that little booklet many years ago). He said "some years I am a few hundred dollars ahead and other years behind, in the long run it is an interest, but not a money maker".

His other passion was smoking and he didn't believe that it causes cancer, he was living proof of it - at least in his case it worked. Nobody would know better than Peter Kluytenberg and his wife Tina, Ernie and Mary's Managers at MBS. They have been available 24/7 for some years for Ernie and Mary. Ernie and Mary were most grateful for all their help and assistance. Thank you, Peter and Tina!





#### Rudolf Steiner and Antroposophy

Rudolf Steiner was born on 27 February 1861 in today's Croatia. He was born in a relatively poor family, where philosophy was unimportant. However, he studied environmental sciences, later literature and philosophy. Goethe and Nietzsche were great thinkers along his way. Steiner founded the Anthroposophical Society in 1912. The Goetheanum in Dornach, Switzerland became its centre.

Anthroposophy, the "wisdom about the human", is both 'view of the world' and 'way to knowledge', and it is influenced by spirituality. Steiner believed that he was able to see supernatural things, which enabled him to work in any area. He was philosopher, teacher, mystic, esoteric. scientist, dramatic adviser and architect. His work both fascinated and provoked people. His view of the world empowered him to give impulses in several areas of life. Three examples:

**Steiner school:** Rudolf Steiner started working as a private teacher. 1919, Emil Molt, a German factory owner, founded the 'Stuttgarter Waldorfschule'. The school should educationally support the children of the factory workers, independent of their social and financial backgrounds. Steiner takes on the pedagogical management. 34 more schools were founded until the beginning of WW2. In Switzerland, the first Waldorf School - also known as

Rudolf Steiner School – was founded in Dornach in 1921. Today, there are approx. 30 schools in Switzerland and more than 1200 worldwide.

Biodynamic agriculture: Worried about their plants, animals and their own food, and inspired by Steiner's anthroposophical teachings, a group of farmers asked for his assistance in 1924. Steiner's lectures are classified as the beginning of biodynamic agriculture. His eco-pioneering principle: Agriculture should operate as a closed and balanced cycle. This means that a farm keeps only the number of animals that can be fed with the food grown on the same farm. In return, the animals provide the manure to sustain the plants on this farm.

New approach to medicine: Towards the end of the 1910s, Steiner together with medical doctors and chemists developed a new approach to medicine. Influencing part of the team was medical doctor Ita Wegman. The group was convinced, that the human body can heal itself, it just needs a bit of support from time to time. Hence, they developed medicine with natural ingredients designed to support the human body's healing mechanisms. In 1921 Steiner and Wegman founded the brand *Weleda*; the name is based on the Germanic medical priest and prophet Veleda.

# Gotthard Base Tunnel presentation at QUT in Brisbane

The Consulate of Switzerland in Brisbane organised an interesting presentation on the Gotthard Base tunnel by Thomas Gut, Leader Lifecycle Management and Gotthard Line Maintenance, SBB AG, who visited the Queensland University of Technology (QUT) Graduate School of Business last November.

Swiss Society of Queensland members were invited to attend to gain information about this extraordinary project. Construction started in 1999 and it is in function since 2016. The 57km long double-tunnel carries freight and passenger trains and needs regular maintenance and equipment upgrades.

The presentation encompassed information about the size of the base tunnel; cost; speed of construction; efficiency of transport North-South; ecological point of view; difficulties of maintenance with equipment having various lifespan; difficulties to reach the equipment through the actual tubes; desire to build a 3rd tunnel for efficient maintenance access; and the use of the actual mountain line as a backup.

#### **Gotthard Base Tunnel**

Switzerland can claim the longest rail tunnel in the world! The Swiss constructed two separate tunnels

for each direction at 57 km a pop. To keep the tracks as level as possible, they had to drill 2300 meters below the mountain. This makes the Gotthard Base Tunnel the deepest tunnel on Planet Earth.

They have built two sections inside the tunnel where trains can change to the other one-way tunnel. This can be used in emergencies or when an issue causes one tunnel to be out of operation.

The deepest point of the tunnel is 2.3 kilometers below Piz Vatgira - that's 1.5 times the depth of the Grand Canyon as seen from the rim!

20 minutes is how long a trip through the tunnel takes, 28.2 million tons of rock was excavated from the Alps over the years. In a clever move. the engineers "recycled" most of the rock and returned it to the inside of the mountain as concrete. The rest was used to level the mountainous terrain, and the rest of the rest to create three artificial islands in Lake Uri. 2400. workers were simultaneously involved in digging Switzerland's tube. Most of the Swiss population was unaware of the Herculean efforts going on every day for 17 years.
